# 46 Years of Change!

**Our lives have changed drastically since Seattle hosted the 1962 World's Fair and added the Space Needle to the Emerald City's skyline.**

**Between April 21 and October 21, 1962, close to 10 million people visited the Fair to climb the Space Needle, ride the Monorail, see the exhibits, take in a show, and enjoy the food, fun, and festivities. So by visiting Seattle in 2008, you are continuing an amazing tradition.**

**In 1962, we had IBM, Kodak, 3M, and GE with mainframes, Fortran, Cobal, open reel magnetic tape, and key punch machines.**

**Now we have Microsoft, Oracle, Apple, Sun, and Google with Unix, Windows, Visual Basic, LANs, SQL Server, laptops, and Ipods.**

**In 1962, we had typewriters, thermal fax paper, carbon copies, Photostats, mimeograph machines, teletypes, file cabinets, rolodexes, and microforms.**

**Now we have PCs, the World Wide Web, browsers, search engines, email, HTML, blogs, free-ware, cell phones, Blackberrys and PDAs, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, digital cameras, computer games, massive inexpensive digital storage, Post Its, cable TV, communication satellites, spam, viruses, and worms.**

**In 1962 we had records management, now we have content management.**
